**Climate**: The usual weather conditions in a particular area, such as temperature, rainfall, and wind, observed over a long period of time.

Canyon: A deep, narrow valley with steep sides, often with a river running through it, formed by erosion over millions of years.

**Human Features**: Elements of the landscape that have been created or changed by people, such as buildings, roads, bridges, and farmland.

Physical Features: Natural elements of the Earth's surface, such as mountains, rivers, forests, and deserts.

Natural Disaster: A sudden, severe event caused by natural forces, such as earthquakes, floods, hurricanes, or volcanic eruptions, that can cause significant damage and danger to people and the environment.

**Prairie**: A large, open area of grassland, often found in North America, where trees are scarce, and the land is mostly flat.

**Terrain**: The physical features of an area of land, including its elevation, slope, and the type of ground it covers, such as rocks, soil, or vegetation.

**Social Geography**: The study of how people and their communities interact with and are affected by the natural and human-made features of their environment.
