Children at Nantwich Primary Academy will learn about the importance of laws, including those that govern their class, school or the country. Consequences of breaking the law and rules. They will understand how to keep safe and who can help them to remain safe.	Children follow the Coloured Behaviour Zones behaviour system.  School rules are consistently in place across the whole school and all are asked to remind each other including the Principal, Teachers, Classroom Assistants, Lunchtime Supervisors and the children.  Whole School assemblies will remind children of their rights, and work through Votes For Schools weekly will remind children of their rights. Pupils will take part in Parliament week annually.	Children are able to articulate how and why we need to behave in school and in society. They can demonstrate they understand acceptable behaviour through actions.  Children know they have a right but also know that with that right comes responsibility.  Children are able to discuss important issues and respectfully share their ideas with others.  Children feel safe and know what to do if their safety is compromised.
