<p>Visit Math Antics and watch the long division help videos (the Math Antics link is on our year 6 class page).</p> <p>Show me some examples of long division in your homework book.</p>	<p>Find out some facts about WW2 bomber planes e.g. how many people flew in the plane, how many bombs did it hold, how far did they fly, any other interesting facts.</p> <p><i>For a bonus dojo, compare a UK / US and German bomber plane!</i></p>	<p>Research World War II food rationing and find out what people were allowed, and how much of it they were allowed, and maybe even what the price was.</p> <p><i>Try to make your own small version of a ration book for 1 extra dojo point!</i></p>
<p>Find out 10 interesting facts about Sir Isaac Newton, famous scientist.</p>	<p><b>Dress up as somebody from World War II using whatever you can find - be as creative as you wish and send a photo on Class Dojo portfolio.</b></p>	<p>Draw a really detailed drawing / sketch of a famous World War II fighter plane or bomber</p> <p>Alternatively, instead of drawing, make your own model of the plane with accurate colours / markings.</p>
<p>Find out what symbols are used in drawings of electrical circuits. Here are some to look out for:</p> <p>Wire, battery, bulb, switch, buzzer, motor</p>	<p>Have a go at trying to write a World War 2 poem as part of remembrance.</p> <p>There are lots of examples online by famous poets and children in schools if you search.</p>	<p>Create a collage of one of the following using bits of materials or magazines etc:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- A soldier</li> <li>- A WW2 nurse</li> <li>- An evacuee</li> <li>- Winston Churchill</li> </ul>
