What do you think tessellating means?




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Vocabulary

Tessellating	decorate or cover (a surface) with a pattern of repeated shapes
Pattern	a repeated decorative design
Repeating	done or occurring again several times in the same way
Traditional	existing in or as part of a tradition
Abstract	non-lifelike portrayal of real-world objects, people and scenes that are usually difficult for other people to recognize
Influenced	the power to have an important effect on someone or something

We are going to start by exploring pattern and how different artists use it to express themselves. We are then going to look at how to create a pattern ourselves, especially looking at tessellating shapes and how they fit together.





We are going to link our art to our Geography topic of 'Extreme Earth' and look at how we can use natural disasters to influence our patterns.
