Year 4 Newsletter Summer 2023



Welcome back to another busy term at NPA. The following newsletter will highlight everything you need to know for the Summer term.

<u>Class Dojo</u>

We continue to use Class Dojo – if you have a problem accessing your child's details (points earned etc) or cannot see any class stories / school stories, please do not hesitate to ask for help. Usually, we can sort this after school using an internet connected device of your own, and our class computer, so we'll try our best!

<u>Homework</u>

Your child will receive a Homework Overview based around a curriculum area each half term. It will explain the choices for home learning that should take place and one piece should be returned via Class Dojo Portfolio each week. Full details will be on the Homework Overview and work will be celebrated each week.

Each half term, your child will also receive a half termly spelling list. This shows which spellings your child will be tested on each week. These spellings should be practiced regularly for the weekly spelling test. Weekly homework should also include time to work on TT Rockstar and ReadTheory. Even 10 minutes a day will have a hugely positive impact on your child's learning.

Times Table Rockstar

Your child has an account on Times-Table Rockstars and should be practicing regularly to increase their recall and rock speed. We have a times table check coming up in June and the children must know their tables fluently. Practising on Soundcheck and Studio is a great way to practise. Here is a link: www.ttrockstars.com

Learning Powers / Dojo Master / Rewards



Here at Nantwich Primary Academy our Learning Powers are the values we use to help us become lifelong learners. They are the building blocks in developing the 'powers' we need to be all round good learners! Each week we celebrate these in our Celebration Assembly and School Newsletter. The children also receive one of the characters to look after for the week.

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Year 4 Summer Curriculum 2023

English/Guided Reading: In English, we will be reading; Beowulf. This is a fantastic story which provides many writing opportunities for us to explore. In Guided Reading we will be delving into Michael Morpurgo's' tale further allowing us to understand the bravery of Beowulf and the challenges he had to undertake!. We will also be reading a non-fiction text about The Vikings and exploring their lives and how it differs to ours today.

<u>Maths:</u> We will be exploring Decimals in depth this half term, before moving on to money and time later into the term. We will also continue to practise our timestables ready for our check in June.

<u>Science</u>: This half term, we will be looking at Sound and asking – 'How do we hear different sounds?' We will then move onto to look at Animals including Humans and how we are all similar.

<u>Geography/History/Art/DT</u>: Our new topic is 'The Vikings' and we will be exploring the ruthless lives of the invaders, how they conquered Great Britain and what happened once they got here! We will also be looking at how the Anglo-Saxon's adapted to their arrival and how the two tribes settled together – peacefully.

<u>PE:</u> We are very fortunate for this term as there are two PE sessions on Tuesdays and Friday. <u>Please ensure your</u> <u>child wears a PE kit to school on these days.</u>

<u>**RE:</u>** We will be looking at Christianity in the first half of the term and the different celebrations and traditions they have. We will then be looking at comparing the three religions we have studied this year; Judaism, Islam and Christianity.</u>

French: We will be learning about different instructions in the classroom. We will be continue our conversation skills in the classroom and trying to ask each other questions! This term, we will also be looking at practising our writing in French and how to use accents and masculine and feminine verbs.

<u>Reminders</u>

Reading diaries/Reading books

Please remember that we will allow the children to change their reading books each Monday and Friday and use this opportunity to check through their diaries. Reading regularly at home will have a significant impact on the number of words your child will meet and have a knock-on effect on the quality of their writing, speech, and creative ideas.

<u>Snack</u>

Snack options continue to be available (purchased online) with bacon baps for £1 on Fridays. They may buy a piece of toast and drink for break, if needed. Payments for snack should be made at the end of each week ready for the following week.

<u>STEM</u>

We will be continuing to develop cross curricular learning through STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics). This will include mini STEM activities and enrichment days developing problem solving, creativity, teamwork, independent thinking and communication.

My Happy Mind

As shared in NPA News, we will continue to build resilience, self-esteem, confidence and a balanced happy mind through the five modules which teach positive habits. The children will learn about their brain and how to look after it, about character, gratitude, positive relationships and meaningful goal setting.

PE Kit/School Uniform

Your child will have PE every Tuesday and Friday. PE kit is a plain white round neck t-shirt, black shorts or joggers and pumps/trainers. A black jumper or school jumper can also be worn. Children must wear PE kit to school on the allocated days. School Uniform should be correctly worn at all times this can be found on the school website.
